LSSI is the largest statewide provider of social services in Illinois and last year served over 63,000 people in communities across Illinois.

Prior to his nonprofit work, David worked as an attorney in private practice in Chicago, specializing in estate planning, and probate. He is a member of the Illinois Bar, receiving his JD degree from DePaul University School of Law. He and his wife Cindy are members of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Naperville.
